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9	1. This matter was scheduled for hearing before the California Gambling Control
10	Commission (Commission) pursuant to Business and Professions Code sections 19870 and 19871
11	and Title 4, California Code of Regulations (CCR) section 12060, in Sacramento, California, on
12	November 1, 2018 at 10:00 a.m.
13	2. Thea Bun (Applicant) failed to appear and was not represented at the hearing.
14	FINDINGS OF FACT
15	3. On or about November 1, 2018, the Bureau received an Initial Regular Work
16	Permit/Temporary Work Permit Application from Applicant.
17	4. On or about April 13, 2018, the Bureau of Gambling Control (Bureau) issued its
18	Work Permit Employee Background Investigation Report in which it concluded that Applicant
19	was unqualified for licensure pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19857 and
20	disqualified for licensure pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19859. The Bureau
21	recommended that the Commission deny Applicant's application.
22	5. On or about May 24, 2018, the Commission considered Applicant's application
23	and voted to refer the matter to an evidentiary hearing pursuant to Title 4, CCR section 12060,
24	subdivision (b).
25	6. Applicant received notice of Commission consideration of Applicant's application
26	in two ways. First, Commission staff mailed an evidentiary hearing referral letter via certified
27	mail to Applicant's address of record on May 29, 2018 which included a blank Notice of Defense

1	form with instructions to return it to the Commission within 15 days of receipt or else the
2	Commission may issue a default decision. A copy of the letter was mailed to Applicant's
3	Designated Agent. Commission staff received no response from Applicant including a Notice of
4	Defense form or otherwise as of July 17, 2018. (Exhibit A)
5	7. Second, Applicant further received notice of the hearing through a hearing notice
6	sent certified mail on July 24, 2018 to Applicant's address of record which included Exhibit A
7	and stated that the hearing was set to occur on November 1, 2018 at 10:00 a.m. A copy of the
8	letter was mailed to Applicant's Designated Agent. Commission staff received no reply.
9	DETERMINATION OF ISSUES
10	8. An application to receive a license constitutes a request for a determination of the
11	applicant's general character, integrity, and ability to participate in, engage in, or be associated
12	with, controlled gambling. (Bus. & Prof. Code § 19856, subd. (b).)
13	9. In addition, the burden of proving Applicant's qualifications to receive any license
14	from the Commission is on the applicant. (Bus. & Prof. Code § 19856, subd. (a).)
15	10. At an evidentiary hearing pursuant to Business and Professions Code sections
16	19870 and 19871 and Title 4, CCR section 12060 the burden of proof rests with the applicant to
17	demonstrate why a license or other approval should be issued. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 4, § 12060,
18	subd. (i).)
19	11. Title 4, CCR section 12052, subdivision (c), provides in pertinent part:
20	(c) An applicant for any license, permit, finding of suitability,
21	renewal, or other approval shall be given notice of the meeting at which the application is scheduled to be heard. Notice shall be given pursuant to
22	Section 12006.
23	* * *
24	(2) If the application is to be scheduled at an evidentiary hearing, pursuant to subsections (a) or (b) of Section 12060, the notice
25	of hearing shall inform the applicant of the following:
26	* * *
27	(F) The waiver of an evidentiary hearing, or failure of the applicant to submit a Notice of Defense, or failure of an
28	applicant to appear at an evidentiary hearing, may result in:

1 2	1. A default decision being issued by the Commission based upon the Bureau report, any supplemental reports by the Bureau and any other documents or testimony already provided or which might
3	be provided to the Commission
4	12. The Commission takes official notice of the Bureau report, any supplemental
5	reports by the Bureau and any other documents or testimony already provided to it in this matter
6	as required by Business and Professions Code section 19870, subdivision (a) and Title 4, CCR
7	section 12052, subdivision (c)(2)(F)(1).
8	13. The Commission has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
9	14. The Commission may deny Applicant's application based upon the Bureau report,
10	any supplemental reports by the Bureau and any other documents or testimony already provided
11	to it, pursuant to CCR section 12052, subdivision (c)(2)(F)(1), and Business and Professions
12	Code sections 19857 and 19859.
13	15. The Commission may further also deny Applicant's application based upon
14	Applicant's failure to prove to the Commission Applicant is qualified to receive either a work
15	permit, as required by Business and Professions Code section 19856(a) and Title 4, CCR section
16	12060, subdivision (i).
17	16. Therefore, as the Applicant failed to return a Notice of Defense form, did not
18	attend the default hearing, and did not submit any information or evidence in favor of granting
19	Applicant's Application, Applicant did not meet Applicant's burden of demonstrating why a work
20	permit should be issued pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19856(a) and Title 4,
21	CCR section 12060(i). The Commission further finds that pursuant to California Code of
22	Regulations, Title 4, section 12052, subdivision (c)(2)(F)(1), Applicant's Application is subject to
23	denial.

1	NOTICE OF APPLICANT'S APPEAL RIGHTS
2	Applicant has the following appeal rights available under state law:
3	Title 4, CCR section 12064, subsection (a) and (b) provide, in part:
4	(a) After the Commission issues a decision following a GCA hearing conducted
5	pursuant to Section 12060, an applicant denied a license, permit, registration, or finding of suitability, or whose license, permit, registration, or finding of
6	suitability has had conditions, restrictions, or limitations imposed upon it, may request reconsideration by the Commission within 30 calendar days of service of
7	the decision, or before the effective date specified in the decision, whichever is
8	later. (b) A request for reconsideration shall be made in writing to the Commission,
9	copied to the Bureau, and shall state the reasons for the request, which must be based upon either:
10	(1) Newly discovered evidence or legal authorities that could not
11	reasonably have been presented before the Commission's issuance of the decision or at the hearing on the matter; or,
12	(2) Other good cause which the Commission may decide, in its sole
13	discretion, merits reconsideration.
13 14	Business and Professions Code section 19870, subdivision (e) provides:
15	A decision of the commission denying a license or approval, or imposing any
15 16	condition or restriction on the grant of a license or approval may be reviewed by petition pursuant to Section 1085 of the Code of Civil Procedure. Section 1094.5 of the Code of Civil Procedure shall not apply to any judicial proceeding described in
17	the foregoing sentence, and the court may grant the petition only if the court finds that the action of the commission was arbitrary and capricious, or that the action exceeded the commission's jurisdiction.
18	Title 4, CCR section 12066, subsection (c) provides:
19	The 4, CCK section 12000, subsection (c) provides.
20	A decision of the Commission denying an application or imposing conditions on a license shall be subject to judicial review as provided in Business and Professions
21	Code section 19870, subdivision (e). Neither the right to petition for judicial review nor the time for filing the petition shall be affected by failure to seek
22	reconsideration.

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DECLARATION OF STEPHANIE CLARK

I, Stephanie Clark, declare as follows:

I am employed by the California Gambling Control Commission as an analyst in the Commission's Licensing Division. Thea Bun's case has been assigned to me for processing.

On May 29, 2018, I mailed a Gambling Control Act hearing referral letter to Thea Bun at the California Code of Regulations (CCR) Title 4, Division 18, Chapter 1, section 12006. This letter provided notice to Thea Bun that consideration of her application was being referred to a Gambling Control Act hearing pursuant to CCR, Title 4, Division 18, Chapter 1, section 12060(b). This letter included a Notice of Defense form (CGCC-ND-002) with instructions to return the Notice of Defense to the Commission within 15 days of receipt in order to preserve their right to an administrative hearing. A subsequent registered letter was sent on June 29, 2018. Both statuses are attached.

Today is July 17, 2018, and I have not received the Notice of Defense form or any communication from Thea Bun regarding a request for a Gambling Control Act hearing.
