7	TITLE 4. BUSINESS REGULATIONS.
8	DIVISION 18. CALIFORNIA GAMBLING CONTROL COMMISSION.

10	CHAPTER 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS.
11	
12	Section 12008. Registration Fees; License Fees.
13	Every application for a registration or license issued pursuant to this division shall be
14	accompanied by a fee that is authorized by Business and Professions Code section 19951(a).
15	Every application for a work permit issued pursuant to Chapter 2 of this division shall be
16	accompanied by a fee that is authorized by Business and Professions Code section 19915. The
17	fee for the initial application and renewal of registrations, licenses or work permits issued
18	pursuant to this division is as follows:
19	(a) For an initial and renewal Gambling License issued pursuant to Chapter 6, the fee is one
20	thousand dollars (\$1000).
21	(b) For an initial and renewal a Gambling Establishment Key Employee License issued
22	pursuant to Chapter 6, the fee is seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750). as follows:
23	(1) For an interim key employee license, the fee is twenty-five dollars (\$25).
24	(2) For an initial and renewal license, the fee is seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750).
25	(3) For a replacement license, the fee is twenty-five dollars (\$25).
26	(c) For an initial and renewal Work Permit issued pursuant to Chapter 2, the fee is as follows:
27	(1) For a Regular Work Permit, the fee is two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250).
28	(2) For a Temporary Work Permit, the fee is twenty-five dollars (\$25), in addition to the
29	regular work permit fee in paragraph (1) of this subsection.
30	(d) For a Third-Party Proposition Player Services registration or license issued pursuant to
31	Chapter 2.1, the fee is as follows:

1 (1) For an initial and renewal registration of all registration types, the fee is five hundred 2 dollars (\$500). 3 (2) For a temporary player registration, the fee is twenty-five dollars (\$25), in addition to the 4 regular player registration fee specified in paragraph (1) of this subsection. (3) For an initial and renewal license as a primary owner or owner, the fee is one thousand 5 dollars (\$1000). 6 7 (4) For an initial and renewal license as a supervisor, the fee is seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750). 8 9 (5) For an initial and renewal license as a player or other employee, the fee is five hundred dollars (\$500). 10 (e) For a Gambling Business registration or license issued pursuant to Chapter 2.2, the fee is 11 12 as follows: (1) For an initial and renewal registration for all registration types, the fee is five hundred 13 dollars (\$500). 14 (2) For an initial and renewal license as a primary owner or owner, the fee is one thousand 15 16 dollars (\$1000). 17 (3) For an initial and renewal license as a supervisor, the fee is seven hundred and fifty 18 dollars (\$750). (4) For an initial and renewal license as a player or other employee, the fee is five hundred 19 20 dollars (\$500). (f) For a Gambling Equipment Manufacturer or Distributor Registration issued pursuant to 21 22 Chapter 4, the fee is as follows: (1) For an initial and renewal registration as a Class A Equipment Manufacturer or 23 24 Distributor, the fee is five hundred dollars (\$500). (2) For an initial and renewal registration as an "antique collector", within the meaning of 25 26 Sections 12300(b)(1) and 12301(b)(10)(B), the fee is forty dollars (\$40). 27 (3) For a Class B Equipment Manufacturer or Distributor Registration, no fee is required. 28 Note: Authority cited: Sections 19811, 19824, 19840, 19841, 19853(a)(3), 19854, 19915, 19951(a) and 19984, 29 Business and Professions Code. 5	ARTICLE 1. DEFINITIONS AND GENERAL PROVISIONS.
6	Section 12335. Definitions.
7	(a) Except as otherwise provided in section 12002(b) of these regulations, the definitions in
8	Business and Professions Code section 19805 shall govern the construction of this chapter.
9	(b) As used in this chapter:
10	(1) "Table Fee" means the fee established by Business and Professions Code, section
11	19951(b)(2).
12	(2) "Portable Personal Key Employee License" or "Key Employee License" means a license
13	which authorizes the holder to be associated with any gambling enterprise as a key employee,
14	provided the key employee terminates employment with one gambling enterprise before
15	commencing work for another, as provided in Business and Professions Code sections 19805,
16	subdivisions (w) and (x), and 19854, subdivision (c).

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21	ARTICLE 2. LICENSING GAMBLING LICENSES.
22	Section 12340. Gambling Licenses and Key Employee License.
23	(a) No person may conduct a gambling operation without a current valid gambling license
24	issued by the Commission.
25	(b) Except as provided in Business and Professions Code Section 19883 and Section 12347,
26	no person may be a key employee of a gambling operation without a current valid key employee
27	license issued by the Commission.
28	(eb) A state-gambling license-and key employee license shall be valid for a period of two (2)
29	years.

Processing Times – Initial Applications. 13 14 (ab) Except as provided in subsection (bc), initial gambling or key employee license applications submitted pursuant to this chapter shall be processed within the following 15 16 timeframes: (1) The maximum time within which the Commission shall notify the applicant in writing 17 that an application or a resubmitted application is complete and accepted for initial processing by 18 the Commission, or that an application or a resubmitted application is deficient and identifying 19 20 what specific additional information is required, is 20 days after receipt of the application. For the purposes of this section, "application" means the Application for State Gambling License, 21 CGCC-030 (Rev. 05/08) and the Application for Gambling Establishment Key Employee 22 23 License, CGCC 031 (Rev. 05/08), as referenced referred to in paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of this Section 12342. An application is not complete unless accompanied by the fee specified in 24 subsection (a) of Section 12008 for a gambling license-or subsection (b) of Section 12008 for a 25 key employee license. In addition, an applicant shall submit with the application, any 26 supplemental information required in paragraph (a) of this section by Section 12342 for review 27 by the Bureau pursuant to paragraph (3) of this subsection. The Commission shall not review the 28 29 supplemental information for completeness. (2) An application for a gambling license and the supplemental information shall be 30 31 forwarded by the Commission to the Bureau within 10 days of the date that the Commission determines that the application is complete. 32

(3) The Bureau shall review the supplemental information submitted for completeness and
notify the applicant of any deficiencies in the supplemental information, or that the supplemental
information is complete, within 30 days of the date that the application and supplemental
information are received by the Bureau from the Commission. Notwithstanding this subsection,
subsequent to acceptance of the supplemental information as complete, the Bureau may pursuant
to Business and Professions Code section 19866 require the applicant to submit additional
information.

(4) Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19868, the Bureau shall, to the extent 8 practicable, submit its recommendation to the Commission within 180 days after the date the 9 Bureau is in receipt of both the completed application pursuant to paragraph (2) of this 10 subsection and the completed supplemental information pursuant to paragraph (3) of this 11 subsection. If the Bureau has not concluded its investigation within 180 days, then it shall 12 inform the applicant and the Commission in writing of the status of the investigation and shall 13 also provide the applicant and the Commission with an estimated date on which the investigation 14 may reasonably be expected to be concluded. 15

(5) The Commission shall grant or deny the application within 120 days after receipt of the
final written recommendation of the Bureau concerning the application, except that the
Commission may notify the applicant in writing that additional time, not to exceed 30 days, is
needed.

(bc) The processing times specified in subsection (ab) may be exceeded in any of the
 following instances:

22 (1) The applicant has agreed to extension of the time.

23 (2) The number of licenses to be processed exceeds by 15 percent the number processed in

32 (a) Each application for renewal of a state gambling license or for renewal of a key employee

license shall be accompanied by all of the following: 1 2 (1) A completed application: 3 (A1) Applicants for a state gambling license shall use the form A completed "Application for State Gambling License, CGCC-030 (Rev. 05/08)." as referred to in paragraph (1) of subsection 4 (a) of Section 12342. 5 6 (B) Applicants for a key employee license shall use the form "Application for Gambling Establishment Key Employee License, CGCC-031 (Rev. 05/08)." 7 8 (2) A nonrefundable application fee in the amount specified in subsection (a) of Section 12008 for a gambling license-or subsection (b) of Section 12008 for a key employee license. 9 (b) Each key employee or other person whose name is required to be endorsed upon the 10 license shall submit a separate application for renewal of that person's license, together with the 11 application fee specified in subsection (ba) of Section 12008. 12 (c) All applications for renewal of state gambling licenses and key employee licenses for a 13 particular gambling-establishment enterprise shall be submitted together as a single package to 14 the California Gambling Control Commission. 15 16 (d) If, after a review of an application for renewal of a state gambling license or a key employee license, the Bureau determines that further investigation is needed, the applicant shall 17 18 submit an additional sum of money that, in the judgment of the Chief of the Bureau, will be adequate to pay the anticipated investigation and processing costs, in accordance with Business 19 20 and Professions Code section 19867. 21 Note: Authority cited: Sections 19811, 19824, 19840, 19841, 19851, 19854 and 19951, Business and Professions Code. the Commission, or that an application or a resubmitted application is deficient and identifying 1 2 what specific additional information is required, is 10 days after receipt of the application. For 3 the purposes of this section, "application" means the Application for State Gambling License, 4 CGCC-030-(Rev. 05/08) and the Application for Gambling Establishment Key Employee License, CGCC 031 (Rev. 05/08), referenced referred to in paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of 5 Section 12342. An application is not complete unless accompanied by the fee specified in 6 subsection (a) of Section 12008 for a gambling license or subsection (b) of Section 12008 for a 7 key employee license. 8 (3) An application for a gambling license shall be forwarded by the Commission to the 9 Bureau for processing within five days of the date that the Commission determines that the 10 application is complete. 11 12 (4) The Bureau shall submit its written recommendation report concerning the renewal application, which may include a recommendation pursuant to Business and Professions Code 13 section 19826, subdivision (a), to the Commission no later than 45 days prior to the expiration of 14 the current license. 15 16 (bf) The processing times specified in paragraphs (2) through and including (4) of subsection (ae) may be exceeded in any of the following instances: 17 18 (1) The applicant has agreed to extension of the time. (2) The number of licenses to be processed exceeds by 15 percent the number processed in 19 20 the same calendar quarter the preceding year. Interim Key Employee Status While Application Pending. 26 27 (a) Unless given 30 days after hiring to file an application for key employee licensure pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19883 (corporate owner licensee exemption for key 28 29 employees), gambling establishment employees holding a valid work permit or license for any gambling establishment may begin work as an interim key employee provided that written notice is 30 given to the Commission and Bureau within ten days of the employee's assumption of key employee 31

1	duties, accompanied by a description of the key employee duties the employee will perform and a
2	copy of the employee's current work permit or license for any licensed gambling establishment.
3	(b) An interim key employee shall, within 30 days of assuming a key employee position,
4	submit the following:
5	(1) The Commission's key employee license application, CGCC-031, as referenced in
6	Section 12342,
7	(2) The Bureau's key employee supplemental application, BGC-APP-016A, as referenced_in
8	Section 12342, and
9	(3) All applicable fees and deposits due for a key employee license.
10	(c) An applicant for key employee licensure currently working as an interim key employee
11	shall cease working in a key employee position if the application for key employee licensure is
12	abandoned or denied, if the employee's work permit is revoked or cancelled before the key
13	employee license is approved, or if the Executive Director notifies the applicant and gambling
14	establishment that the interim status is cancelled pursuant to subsection (d), below.
15	(d) With ten day's advance written notice to the interim key employee and to the gambling
16	establishment, the Executive Director shall cancel the interim key employee status based upon
17	the following:
18	(1) Evidence showing that the applicant has sustained any disqualifying criminal convictions;
19	(2) Evidence showing that the applicant is statutorily ineligible for a key employee license
20	under the Act;
21	(3) Evidence which discloses that having the applicant serve as a interim key employee
22	pending determination of their application may in the judgment of the Executive Director present
23	a danger to the public or to the reputation of controlled gambling in this state;
24	(4) A determination by the Executive Director that the applicant has failed to reveal any fact
25	that is material to, or supplied materially untrue or misleading information on, the applicant's
26	key employee license application;
27	(5) A Bureau recommendation of denial of the applicant's key employee application;
28	(6) Referral by the Commission of the applicant to an evidentiary hearing with direction to
29	the Executive Director to cancel the interim key employee status; or
30	(7) A determination by the Executive Director that the gambling establishment using the
31	interim key employee procedure has shown a pattern or practice of hiring or promoting persons

1	to key employee positions in violation of subsection (a) above or that the gambling establishment
2	has acted in bad faith, with actual knowledge that the persons hired or promoted would be
3	ineligible for licensure.
4	(e) Within ten days of the date of notice of a cancellation of interim status pursuant to this
5	section, the gambling establishment shall notify the Commission in writing of the effective date
6	of the position change for or suspension of the employee, and shall describe the employee's
7	revised job duties, if any.
8	(f) Judicial review of a cancellation of interim status shall be by petition pursuant to section
9	1085 of the Code of Civil Procedure.

14	Section 123486. Mandatory and Discretionary Grounds for Denial of Application for a
15	State Gambling License or Key Employee license.
16	(a) An application for a state gambling license or key employee license shall be denied by the
17	Commission if any of the following apply:
18	(1) The Commission finds that the applicant is ineligible, unqualified, disqualified, or
19	unsuitable pursuant to the criteria set forth in the Act or other applicable law or that granting the
20	license would be inimical to public health, safety, welfare, or would undermine the public trust
21	that gambling operations are free from criminal or dishonest elements.
22	(2) The Commission finds that the local ordinance does not conform to the requirements of
23	Business and Professions Code section 19860.
24	(b) An application for a state gambling license may be denied if:
25	(1) The Commission finds that the applicant meets any of the criteria for license denial set
26	forth in Business and Professions Code section 19862, subdivision (a).
27	(2) The Commission finds that an applicant has attempted to communicate or has
28	communicated ex parte, as that term is defined in Business and Professions Code section 19872,
29	subdivision (e), with one or more Commissioners, through direct or indirect means, regarding the
30	merits of the application while the application is pending disposition at the Bureau or the
31	Commission.
32	(3) The Commission finds that the applicant's past behavior calls into question the

- 1 applicant's qualification requirements and considerations outlined in Business and Professions
- 2 Code section 19856. Examples of past behavior that may be considered include, but are not
- 3 limited to:
- 4 (A) Convictions which demonstrate a pattern of disregard for the law,
- 5 (B) A conviction involving gambling or gambling-related activities,
- 6 (C) A final administrative decision concluding that there was a violation of law involving
- 7 gambling or gambling-related activities, or
- 8 (D) A conviction regarding or final administrative decision concluding that there was a
- 9 violation of campaign finance disclosure or contribution limitations applicable to an election
- 10 conducted pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19960.
- 11 (4) The Commission finds that the applicant has, within ten years immediately preceding the
- submission of the application, willfully or persistently violated any of the following:
- 13 (A) Any regulation adopted by the Commission or Bureau.
- 14 (B) Any condition, limitation, or directive imposed on a previously held-state gambling-or
- 15 key employee license.
- 16 (c) The grounds for denial set forth in this section apply in addition to any grounds prescribed
- by statute or any grounds that would support revocation under chapter 10 of these regulations.

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ARTICLE 3. PORTABLE PERSONAL KEY EMPLOYEE LICENSE.

- 23 <u>Section 12350. Initial Licenses; Required Forms; Processing Times.</u>
- 24 (a) Except as provided in Business and Professions Code section 19883 and Section 12354,
- 25 <u>no person may be associated with a gambling enterprise as a key employee without a valid key</u>
- 26 employee license issued by the Commission.
- 27 (b) A key employee license, including an interim key employee license, shall be valid for a
- 28 period of two (2) years. If an interim key employee license is issued pursuant to Section 12354,
- 29 the term of the subsequently issued initial key employee license shall be for the remaining
- 30 <u>unexpired term of the interim license.</u>
- 31 (c) Any person applying for a key employee license shall submit the following:
- 32 (1) A completed "Application for Gambling Establishment Key Employee License CGCC-

1	031 (Rev. 08/09)," which is attached in Appendix A to this chapter.
2	(2) A nonrefundable application fee in the amount specified in subsection (b) of Section
3	12008 for a key employee license.
4	(3) A two by two inch color passport-style photograph taken no more than 30 days before
5	submission to the Commission of the key employee application.
6	(4) Key Employee Supplemental Background Investigation Information, BGC-APP-016A
7	(Rev. 08/09), which is hereby incorporated by reference.
8	(5) Authorization to Release Information, BCG-APP-006, as referred to in paragraph (8),
9	subsection (a) of Section 12342.
10	(6) Request for Live Scan Service, BCII 8016, as referred to in paragraph (17), subsection (a)
11	of section 12342.
12	(d) Except as provided in subsection (e), initial key employee license applications submitted
13	pursuant to this chapter shall be processed within the following timeframes:
14	(1) The maximum time within which the Commission shall notify the applicant in writing
15	that an application or a resubmitted application is complete and accepted for initial processing by
16	the Commission, or that an application or a resubmitted application is deficient and identifying
17	what specific additional information is required, is five working days after receipt of the
18	application. For the purposes of this section, "application" means the Application for Gambling
19	Establishment Key Employee License, CGCC-031, referred to in paragraph (1) of subsection (c)
20	of Section 12350. An application is not complete unless accompanied by the fee specified in
21	subsection (b) of Section 12008. In addition, an applicant shall submit with the application, any
22	supplemental information required by subsection (c) of this section for review by the Bureau
23	pursuant to paragraph (3) of this subsection. The Commission shall not review the supplemental
24	information for completeness.
25	(2) An application for a key employee license and the supplemental information shall be
26	forwarded by the Commission to the Bureau within five working days of the date that the
27	Commission determines that the application is complete.
28	(3) The Bureau shall review the supplemental information submitted for completeness and
29	notify the applicant of any deficiencies in the supplemental information, or that the supplemental
30	information is complete, within 30 days of the date that the application and supplemental
31	information are received by the Bureau from the Commission. Notwithstanding this subsection,

1	subsequent to acceptance of the supplemental information as complete, the Bureau may pursuant
2	to Business and Professions Code section 19866 require the applicant to submit additional
3	information.
4	(4) Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19868, the Bureau shall, to the extent
5	practicable, submit its recommendation to the Commission within 180 days after the date the
6	Bureau is in receipt of both the completed application pursuant to paragraph (2) of this
7	subsection and the completed supplemental information pursuant to paragraph (3) of this
8	subsection. If the Bureau has not concluded its investigation within 180 days, then it shall
9	inform the applicant and the Commission in writing of the status of the investigation and shall
10	also provide the applicant and the Commission with an estimated date on which the investigation
11	may reasonably be expected to be concluded.
12	(5) The Commission shall grant or deny the application within 120 days after receipt of the
13	final recommendation of the Bureau concerning the application, except that the Commission may
14	notify the applicant in writing that additional time, not to exceed 30 days, is needed.
15	(e) The processing times specified in subsection (d) may be exceeded in any of the following
16	instances:
17	(1) The applicant has agreed to the extension of the time.
18	(2) The Commission must rely on another public or private entity for all or part of the
19	processing and the delay is caused by that other entity.

24	Section 12351. License Renewals; Required Forms; Processing Times.
25	(a) Each application for renewal of a portable personal key employee license shall be
26	accompanied by all of the following:
27	(1) A completed "Application for Gambling Establishment Key Employee License, CGCC-
28	031," as referred to in paragraph (1) of subsection (c) of Section 12350.
29	(2) A nonrefundable application fee in the amount specified in subsection (b) of Section
30	12008 for a key employee license.
31	(3) A two inch by two inch color passport-style photograph taken no more than 30 days
32	before submission to the Commission of the key employee renewal application.

1	(b) If, after a review of an application for renewal of a key employee license, the Bureau
2	determines that further investigation is needed, the applicant shall submit a sum of money that, in
3	the judgment of the Chief of the Bureau, will be adequate to pay the anticipated investigation and
4	processing costs, in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 19867.
5	(c) Except as provided in subsection (d), key employee renewal license applications shall be
6	processed within the following timeframes:
7	(1) An application for renewal of a key employee license shall be filed by the key employee
8	with the Commission no later than 120 days prior to the expiration of the current license.
9	(2) The maximum time within which the Commission shall notify the applicant in writing
10	that an application or a resubmitted application is complete and accepted for initial processing by
11	the Commission, or that an application or a resubmitted application is deficient and identifying
12	what specific additional information is required, is five working days after receipt of the
13	application. For the purposes of this section, "application" means the Application for Gambling
14	Establishment Key Employee License, CGCC-031, as referred to in paragraph (1) of subsection
15	(c) of Section 12350. An application is not complete unless accompanied by the fee as specified
16	in subsection (b) of Section 12008 for a key employee license.
17	(3) A renewal application for a key employee license shall be forwarded by the Commission
18	to the Bureau for processing within five days of the date that the Commission determines that the
19	application is complete.
20	(4) If the Bureau conducts an investigation, it shall submit a written report concerning the
21	renewal application, which may include a recommendation pursuant to Business and Professions
22	Code section 19826, subdivision (a), to the Commission no later than 45 days prior to the
23	expiration of the current license, unless that application is filed with the Commission less than
24	120 days prior to the expiration of the current license.
25	(d) The processing times specified in subsection (c) may be exceeded in any of the following
26	instances:
27	(1) The applicant has agreed to the extension of the time.
28	(2) The Commission must rely on another public or private entity for all or part of the
29	processing and the delay is caused by that other entity.

1	Section 12352. Employment Status Notification; Replacement License; Required Forms;
2	Processing Times.
3	(a) The holder of a valid key employee license shall notify the Commission within 10 days of
4	acceptance or termination of employment by a gambling enterprise by submitting a completed
5	Notification of Change in Employment Status, CGCC-033 (New 08/09), which is attached in
6	Appendix A to this chapter.
7	(b) The holder of a valid key employee license may request a replacement license in the
8	event the license has been lost, stolen, damaged, or as needed to reflect a change of name by
9	submitting the following:
10	(1) A completed Request for Replacement Key Employee License, CGCC-034 (New 08/09)
11	which is attached in Appendix A to this chapter.
12	(2) A two inch by two inch color passport-style photograph taken no more than 30 days
13	before submission to the Commission of the key employee license replacement request.
14	(3) A nonrefundable fee payable to the Commission as specified in subsection (b) of Section
15	<u>12008.</u>
16	(c) The Executive Director shall issue a replacement portable personal key employee license
17	to the holder as long as there is not any cause for revocation of the key employee license.
18	(d) A replacement key employee license issued pursuant to this section shall be valid during
19	the unexpired term of the replaced key employee license.
20	(e) Upon issuance of the replacement key employee license, the previously issued key
21	employee license shall become invalid and shall not be used thereafter.
22	(f) Applications submitted pursuant to subsection (b) of this section shall be processed within
23	the following time frames:
24	(1) The maximum time within which the Executive Director shall notify the applicant in
25	writing that an application or a resubmitted application is complete and accepted for filing, or
26	that an application or a resubmitted application is deficient and identifying what specific
27	additional information is required, is five working days after receipt of the application.
28	(2) A replacement key employee license shall be either issued or denied within 15 working
29	days after the filing of a complete application.

1	Section 12353. License Content; License Display and Presentation.
2	(a) A key employee license issued by the Commission shall contain all of the following on
3	the front of the license:
4	(1) A photograph of the licensee,
5	(2) The first name of the licensee;
6	(3) The license number; and
7	(4) The expiration date of the license.
8	(b) A key employee license issued by the Commission shall contain the full name of the
9	licensee on the reverse side of the license.
10	(c) A key employee must wear in a visible and conspicuous manner, their key employee
11	license at all times while on duty in the gambling establishment.
12	(d) A key employee license shall be presented upon request without delay or interference, to
13	the employee's gambling enterprise employer or supervisor, a representative of the Commission
14	or Bureau, or anyone requesting to verify the key employee has a valid license.
15	(e) A key employee license shall not be altered in any manner nor shall the content contained
16	on the license be obstructed from view.
17	(f) A key employee license that has expired or is determined to be invalid pursuant to any
18	applicable provision of the Act or this division, shall not be used to gain employment or perform
19	any duties which require a valid key employee license. Any expired or invalid license shall be
20	surrendered to the Commission or Bureau upon request.

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24	Section 12354. Interim Key Employee Licenses; Processing Times.
25	(a) An individual, if holding a valid work permit for any gambling enterprise, may
26	immediately begin to work as an interim key employee provided that the individual submit the
27	following to the Commission within 10 days of hiring:
28	(1) An Application for Interim Key Employee License, CGCC-035 (New 08/09), which is
29	attached in Appendix A to this chapter.
30	(2) A nonrefundable application fee pursuant to subsection (b) of Section 12008.
31	(3) A copy of the employee's valid work permit issued pursuant to section 19912 of the

1	Business and Professions Code for any gambling enterprise.
2	(4) A two inch by two inch color passport-style photograph taken no more than 30 days before
3	submission to the Commission of the interim key employee application, which shall be in addition to
4	the photograph submitted for the initial portable personal key employee license.
5	(b) Applications for issuance of an interim key employee license by the Executive Director
6	shall be processed within the following timeframes:
7	(1) The maximum time within which the Executive Director shall notify the applicant in
8	writing that an application or a resubmitted application is complete and accepted for filing, or
9	that an application or a resubmitted application is deficient and identifying what specific
10	additional information is required, is five working days after receipt of the application.
11	(2) An interim key employee license shall be either granted or denied within 15 working days
12	after the filing of a complete application.
13	(c) Interim key employee license approvals are subject to the following conditions:
14	(1) An application package for an initial portable personal key employee license as required
15	in subsection (c) of Section 12350 must be submitted to the Commission within 30 days of
16	assuming a key employee position.
17	(2) An interim license shall be valid for a period of two years from the date it is issued.
18	(3) Issuance of an interim license does not obligate the Commission to issue a regular key
19	employee license.
20	(4) Issuance of an interim license has no bearing on the question of whether the holder will
21	qualify for issuance of any Commission permit, registration, or license.
22	(5) If, during the term of the interim license any of the following occurs the interim key
23	employee shall cease working in a key employee position:
24	(A) The application for key employee license is abandoned or denied.
25	(B) The interim key employee's work permit expires, is revoked, or is cancelled before the
26	key employee license is approved.
27	(C) The Executive Director notifies the applicant and gambling enterprise that the interim
28	status is cancelled pursuant to subsection (e), of this section.
29	(d) Upon issuance or denial of a regular key employee license by the Commission, the
30	interim license previously issued shall become invalid and shall not be used thereafter.
31	(e) With ten day's advance written notice to the interim key employee and to the gambling

1	enterprise, the Executive Director shall cancel the interim key employee license based upon the
2	following:
3	(1) Evidence showing that the applicant has sustained any disqualifying criminal convictions;
4	(2) Evidence showing that the applicant is statutorily ineligible for a key employee license
5	under the Act;
6	(3) Evidence which discloses that having the applicant serve as an interim key employee
7	pending determination of their application may in the judgment of the Executive Director present
8	a danger to the public or to the reputation of controlled gambling in this state;
9	(4) A determination by the Executive Director that the applicant has failed to reveal any fact
10	that is material to, or supplied materially untrue or misleading information on, the applicant's
11	key employee license application;
12	(5) A Bureau recommendation of denial of the applicant's key employee application;
13	(6) Referral by the Commission of the applicant to an evidentiary hearing with direction to
14	the Executive Director to cancel the interim key employee status; or
15	(7) A determination by the Executive Director that the gambling enterprise using the interim
16	key employee procedure has shown a pattern or practice of hiring or promoting persons to key
17	employee positions in violation of subsection (a) above or that the gambling enterprise has acted
18	in bad faith, with actual knowledge that the persons hired or promoted would be ineligible for
19	licensure.
20	(f) Within ten days of the date of notice of a cancellation of interim status pursuant to this
21	section, the gambling enterprise shall notify the Commission in writing of the effective date of
22	the position change for or suspension of the employee, and shall describe the employee's revised
23	job duties, if any.
24	(g) Judicial review of a cancellation of interim status shall be by petition pursuant to section
25	1085 of the Code of Civil Procedure.
26	(h) This section shall apply to any individual employed in the capacity of a key employee,
27	whether employed in a gambling establishment owned by a non-corporate licensee or by a
28	corporate licensee, as provided in Business and Professions Code section 19883.

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1	Section 12355. Mandatory and Discretionary Grounds for Denial of Application for a Key
2	Employee License.
3	(a) An application for a portable personal key employee license shall be denied by the
4	Commission if any of the following applies:
5	(1) The Commission finds that the applicant is ineligible, unqualified, disqualified, or
6	unsuitable pursuant to the criteria set forth in the Act or other applicable law or that granting the
7	license would be inimical to public health, safety, welfare, or would undermine the public trust
8	that gambling operations are free from criminal or dishonest elements.
9	(b) An application for a key employee license may be denied if:
10	(1) The Commission finds that an applicant has attempted to communicate or has
11	communicated ex parte, as that term is defined in Business and Professions Code section 19872,
12	subdivision (e), with one or more Commissioners, through direct or indirect means, regarding the
13	merits of the application while the application is pending disposition at the Bureau or the
14	Commission.
15	(2) The Commission finds that the applicant's past behavior calls into question the
16	applicant's qualification requirements and considerations outlined in Business and Professions
17	Code section 19856. Examples of past behavior that may be considered include, but are not
18	limited to:
19	(A) Convictions which demonstrate a pattern of disregard for the law,
20	(B) A conviction involving gambling or gambling-related activities,
21	(C) A final administrative decision concluding that there was a violation of law involving
22	gambling or gambling-related activities, or
23	(D) A conviction regarding or final administrative decision concluding that there was a
24	violation of campaign finance disclosure or contribution limitations applicable to an election
25	conducted pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19960.
26	(3) The Commission finds that the applicant has, within ten years immediately preceding the
27	submission of the application, willfully or persistently violated any of the following:
28	(A) Any regulation adopted by the Commission or Bureau.
29	(B) Any condition, limitation, or directive imposed on a previously held gambling or key
30	employee license.
31	(c) The grounds for denial set forth in this section apply in addition to any grounds prescribed

1	by statute or any grounds that would support revocation under chapter 10 of these regulations.
