



ADVISORY NOTICE

APPROVED REGULATIONS REGARDING:
INELIGIBILITY FOR LICENSING
[SB 112 (CHAPTER 363, STATUTES OF 2017)]

(CGCC-GCA-2017-02-N)

On November 30, 2017, the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) approved regulations which update the California Gambling Control Commission's (Commission) regulations to conform to changes made to eligibility standards as part of Senate Bill (SB) 112 (Chapter 363, Statutes of 2017). On November 30, 2017, the Office of Administrative Law approved these non-substantive changes without regulatory effect. This package was filed with the Secretary of State and became effective on the same day.

SB 112 authorizes exceptions for mandatory denials related to a conviction of a felony for the possession of cannabis that would not constitute a felony or misdemeanor under California law on the date that the application for a license is submitted.

In general, these regulations provide that a requestor for a Third-Party Provider of Proposition Player Services or Gambling Business license is ineligible if the requestor has been convicted of any disqualifying felony under Business and Professions Code section 19859, subdivision (c).

Approved Regulations

This regulatory action has made changes in Chapter 2.1 of Division 18 of Title 4 of the California Code of Regulations. Those changes are as follows:

SECTION 12218.11. INELIGIBILITY FOR LICENSING.

This section provides conditions that make a requestor ineligible for licensing. These conditions include that a requestor is ineligible if the requestor has been convicted of any disqualifying felony under Business and Professions Code section 19859, subdivision (c).

This regulatory action has made changes in Chapter 2.2 of Division 18 of Title 4 of the California Code of Regulations. Those changes are as follows:

SECTION 12236. INELIGIBILITY FOR LICENSING.

This section provides conditions that make a requestor ineligible for licensing. These conditions include that a requestor is ineligible if the requestor has been convicted of any disqualifying felony under Business and Professions Code section 19859, subdivision (c).
