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MINUTES OF AUGUST 13, 2009 COMMISSION MEETING

OPEN SESSION

1. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Dean Shelton called the meeting to order at 10:01 a.m., and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call of Commissioners.

Roll Call of Commissioners was taken with Chairman Dean Shelton and Commissioners Stephanie Shimazu, and Alexandra Vuksich present.

3. Approval of Commission Meeting Minutes for: June 23, 2009 & July 9, 2009

Upon motion of Chairman Shelton, seconded by Commissioner Vuksich and unanimously carried in a vote by roll call with Chairman Shelton and Commissioners Shimazu and Vuksich voting yes, the Commission approved the minutes for June 23 and July 9, 2009.

Deputy Director Tina Littleton indicated that staff had received a request from Station California, LLC to table their Item12C. The Commissioners concurred and Item 12C was tabled until the September 10, Commission meeting.

 State Gambling License of George Hardie, Jr. (Determination of Continuing Eligibility Under Business and Professions Code sections 19856,19857 and 19859): Diamond Jim's Casino: Wizard Gaming, Inc. George Hardie, Jr., Beneficiary Zephyr Inter Vivos Trust

Deputy Director Tina Littleton indicated this item was for the Commissioners to determine the continuing eligibility of Mr. George Hardie, Jr. and the Zephyr Inter Vivos Trust as endorsees on the state gambling license of Wizard Gaming, Inc. due to a felony conviction reportedly sustained by Mr. Hardie, Jr. in Mexico.

Deputy Director Tina Littleton further indicated that staff recommended that the Commission place a new condition on the Wizard Gaming, Inc. license as follows:

• Until the Commission has had an opportunity to make an informed decision regarding the reported "felony conviction" of George Hardie Jr., beneficiary of the Zephyr Inter Vivos Trust (Trust), no funds or other assets shall be distributed from Wizard Gaming, Inc. or Diamond Jim's Casino to the Trust or George Hardie Jr., unless approved in advance in writing by the Executive Director. This condition does not prevent the cardroom or Wizard Gaming, Inc. from distributing adequate funds to George Hardie Jr. or the Trust to satisfy the Trust's taxes, assessment or any other obligation, which may be due and payable to the Trust from Wizard Gaming, Inc. or the cardroom's operation.

Also, staff recommended to the Commissioners the following:

- Pursuant to B&P code sections 19930(a)(b), 19826(b)(c), and Title 4, CCR section 12550(d)(4), the Commission directs the Bureau to investigate and make a recommendation on the information received by the Commission regarding the reported "felony conviction" of George Hardie Jr. in Mexico in order to determine whether Commission action is required or whether an emergency order could be issued in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety, or general welfare.
- The Commission requests George Hardie, Jr. or his designated agent to provide the Commission and Bureau information or documents pertaining to the reported felony conviction of George Hardie Jr. and the ongoing "appeals" in Mexico so the Commission and Bureau may determine whether any action of the Commission or Bureau is required.

Norm Pierce, representing the Bureau of Gambling Control, informed the Commission that the Bureau is awaiting receipt of the certified court documents from Mexico and hope to have them by the end of the week. Upon receipt of the certified court documents, the Bureau will request their legal staff to review the out of country conviction and determine if an accusation will be filed.

Alan Isaacman representing Wizard Gaming requested that the Commission delete the following sentence from the new condition:

 This condition does not prevent the cardroom or Wizard Gaming, Inc. from distributing adequate funds to George Hardie Jr. or the trust to satisfy the Trust's taxes, assessment or any other obligation, which may be due and payable to the Trust from Wizard Gaming, Inc. or the cardroom's operation.

Harlan Goodson representing George Hardie, Jr. indicated that he was agreeable to the condition set by the Commission staff. However, he wanted to make one thing clear, that under Mexican law, there has been no felony conviction. Mr. Goodson also wanted to emphasize that the Bureau needs to thoroughly investigate the documentation to verify that California law would also see the actions of George Hardie, Jr. as a felony.

Upon motion of Commissioner Shimazu, seconded by Commissioner Vuksich and unanimously carried in a vote by roll call with Chairman Shelton and Commissioners Shimazu and Vuksich voting yes, the Commission approved the staff recommendations.

 Request for Approval of Articles of Incorporation (Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19881):

Staff Counsel Jesica Pandika indicated that staff recommended that the Commission approve the California Grand Casino's Articles of Incorporation dated June 30, 2009. Legal has reviewed the Articles of Incorporation and finds that they are in compliance with the California Gambling Control Act. Upon motion of Chairman Shelton, seconded by Commissioner Shimazu and unanimously carried in a vote by roll call with Chairman Shelton and Commissioners Shimazu and Vuksich voting yes, the Commission approved the staff recommendation.

Deputy Director Tina Littleton indicated that staff recommended that the Commission approve the renewal state gambling license for the period of September 1, 2009, through August 31, 2011.

Deputy Director Littleton further indicated that a request had been received from the designated agent, Keith Sharpe, to amend the renewal application to decrease the total number of tables. The request was to decrease the tables by 10 leaving a total of 40 tables. In consultation with the Bureau of Gambling Control, staff recommended that the Commission approve the request.

Upon motion of Chairman Shelton, seconded by Commissioner Vuksich and unanimously carried in a vote by roll call with Chairman Shelton and Commissioners Shimazu and Vuksich voting yes, the Commission approved the staff recommendation including the reduction in tables to a total of 40.

B. Pastime Club: Vernon Lemings, Sole Proprietor

Deputy Director Tina Littleton indicated that staff recommended that the Commission suspend the state gambling license until the owner-licensee obtains a local business license and provides written proof to the Commission.

Deputy Director Littleton further indicated that since staff's original recommendation, it has been determined that a suspension can only occur through an accusation. Since an accusation has not been filed, staff recommended that the Commissioners extend

the state gambling license through October 8, 2009, with the addition of a new condition as follows:

The owner-licensee shall not deal, operate, carry on, conduct, maintain, or expose for play any controlled game at Pastime Club until or unless a local business license has been obtained and a current state gambling license has been issued.

Upon motion of Commissioner Shimazu, seconded by Commissioner Vuksich and unanimously carried in a vote by roll call with Chairman Shelton and Commissioners Shimazu and Vuksich voting yes, the Commission approved the staff recommendation.

C. Village Club: Harvey Souza, Sole Proprietor

Deputy Director Tina Littleton indicated that staff recommended that the Commission approve the renewal state gambling license for the period of September 1, 2009, through August 31, 2011. Upon motion of Chairman Shelton, seconded by Commissioner Shimazu and unanimously carried in a vote by roll call with Chairman Shelton and Commissioners Shimazu and Vuksich voting yes, the Commission approved the staff recommendation.

7. Application for Approval for State Gambling License Including All Associated Applicants and Endorsees– Request to Withdraw (Pursuant to Business and Professions Code sections 19851 and 19869):

Deputy Director Tina Littleton indicated that staff recommended that the Commission approve the applicant's request to withdraw without prejudice. Upon motion of Commissioner Vuksich, seconded by Commissioner Shimazu and unanimously carried in a vote by roll call with Chairman Shelton and Commissioners Shimazu and Vuksich voting yes, the Commission approved the staff recommendation.

8. Request for Reconsideration (Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19824(b) and California Code of Regulations, Title 4, section 12050(c)(6):

Deputy Director Tina Littleton indicated that at the June 25, 2009, Commission meeting, the Commission denied Mr. Soules' application for a key employee portable personal license for failure to provide requested documentation. Upon notification of the Commission's decision, Mr. Soules submitted to the Commission a request for reconsideration which was based upon Mr. Soules providing the requested documentation, specifically, the Military Form DD214.

Deputy Director Tina Littleton further indicated that this item was for the Commissioners to determine if Mr. Soules reconsideration should be granted.

Mr. Adam Soules indicated that he has requested through the Navy Records to receive a copy of his discharge papers since the one received through a research company was hard to read. Mr. Soules further indicated that it would take approximately 8-12 weeks

to receive the requested documentation and the request was made approximately 6 weeks ago.

The Commissioners agreed to allow Mr. Soules reconsideration.

Deputy Director Tina Littleton continued with a staff recommendation that the Commission direct the Bureau, pursuant to B&P code sections 19930(a)(b), 19826(b)(c), and Title 4, CCR section 12550(d)(4), upon receipt of the documentation received from the Navy, to investigate and make a recommendation based on the information received from Mr. Soules.

Upon motion of Chairman Shelton, seconded by Commissioner Vuksich and unanimously carried in a vote by roll call with Chairman Shelton and Commissioners Shimazu and Vuksich voting yes, the Commission approved the staff recommendation for the Bureau to investigate and make a recommendation.
