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MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 15, 2012 COMMISSION MEETING

OPEN SESSION

1. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairperson Stephanie Shimazu called the meeting to order at 10:10 a.m., and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Roll Call of Commissioners.

Roll Call of Commissioners was taken, with Chairperson Stephanie Shimazu and Commissioners Tiffany Conklin, Lauren Hammond and Richard Schuetz present.

By concurrence of the Commissioners agenda item 7.A. Key Employee - Phillip Rogers was continued to a January 2013 Commission Meeting.

- 3. <u>Informational Reports from Gaming Policy Advisory Committee (GPAC) (Business and Professions Code section 19817):</u>
 - A. Process for Selection of Future GPAC Members
 - B. Project for Paperwork Reduction

Executive Director Tina Littleton indicated this agenda item is to afford the Commissioners an opportunity to discuss current GPAC projects and provide feedback as needed. Mr. Ron Werner, GPAC Member, presented Item No. 3.A. – Process for Selection of Future GPAC Members. Discussion ensued amongst the Commissioners which included suggested changes to the GPAC Member Application Form. No action was taken on this item, but will be considered for action at a future Commission Meeting with the recommended changes.

Mr. Norm Pierce, GPAC Member, presented Item 3.B. – Project for Paperwork Reduction. The Commissioners acknowledged that the paperwork efficiencies were specific to Bureau activities and did not require Commission approval, nonetheless expressed support of the proposed plan.

Upon motion of Chairperson Shimazu, seconded by Commissioner Schuetz and unanimously carried in a vote by roll call with Chairperson Shimazu and Commissioners Conklin, Hammond and Schuetz voting yes, the Commission extended the temporary state gambling license with the updated existing temporary conditions and new condition through June 30, 2013.

New Condition:

Mr. Kirkland and Mr. Messina will provide monthly status reports to the Bureau of Gambling Control on the litigation involving Club One Acquisition Corporation in Fresno County Superior Court and the New York State Supreme Court, New York County. These reports will also address the actions taken to resolve the underlying disputes which are the basis for the litigation and provide the status of Club One's plans to pursue Chapter 11 reorganization.

Updated Temporary Conditions:

- 1. The <u>temporary</u> initial license takes effect on the date that the Commission approves the request and expires June 30, 2013. If more time is needed to complete the background process, then the <u>temporary</u> state gambling license can be extended for an appropriate amount of time after consultation with the Bureau.
- 2. Issuance of a <u>temporary</u> license does not obligate the Commission to grant a permanent license. Issuance of a temporary license does not create a vested right in the holder to either extension of the temporary license or to a regular license.
- 3. Issuance of this <u>temporary</u> license does not in any way change the legal requirement that the applicant bears the burden of establishing that he/she is suitable pursuant to Business and Professions (B&P) Code section 19856(a) for a regular license.
- 4. Issuance of this <u>temporary</u> license does not change the license qualification requirements of the Gambling Control Act, including but not limited to B&P Code sections 19856, 19857, 19858, and 19859.
- 5. The applicant has pending applications for regular state gambling licenses. A regular license may or may not be issued, depending upon the results of the complete background investigation and upon the conduct of the applicant and its employees during the term of the <u>temporary</u> license.
- 6. If, during the term of the <u>temporary</u> license, the Executive Director determines that any particular applicant is disqualified for any of the reasons set forth in B&P Code section 19859, the Executive Director shall prepare an order to show cause why that applicant's temporary license should not be cancelled, which shall be considered at the first available noticed Commission meeting. The applicant may address the Commission by way of an oral statement at the noticed Commission meeting and/or may submit documents in support of the temporary licensure not less than five days prior to the meeting. The applicant may request an evidentiary hearing either in writing not less than five days prior to the meeting or at the meeting itself.
- 7. If, during the term of the <u>temporary</u> license, the Executive Director determines that any particular applicant may have violated one or more of the conditions under which the temporary license was issued, the Executive Director shall prepare an order to show cause why that applicant's <u>temporary</u> license should not be cancelled, which shall be considered at the first available noticed Commission meeting. The applicant may address the Commission by way of an oral statement at the noticed Commission meeting and/or may submit documents in support of the temporary licensure not less than five days prior to the meeting. Either in writing not less than five days prior to the meeting itself, the applicant may request an evidentiary hearing.
