- 2. Beginning December 1, 2013, and on a monthly basis thereafter, Normandie Club shall submit to the Bureau of Gambling Control a detailed accounting demonstrating adequate financial backing for all chips in use.
- 3. By December 1, 2013, Normandie Club shall maintain a compliance committee that includes the following:
 - a) An outside member that is from a certified public accounting business with experience in controlled gambling in the State of California
 - *b)* An outside member that has demonstrable credentials and experience in California gaming law
- 4. The compliance committee, as noted in Condition 3, shall meet monthly. The committee's responsibilities shall include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a) Inspection of all background reports on licensing applications
 - b) Approval of Normandie Club's credit policy
 - c) Analysis of credit aging
 - d) Review of litigation
 - e) Review of the termination and discipline of management personnel
 - f) Review of any exception in variance reports over \$500 in a single transaction and \$1,000 monthly
 - g) Review of any policy and procedure changes
 - *h)* Agreement to any contracts, agreements, and transactions of \$10,000 or more, not including chip transactions
 - i) Review of the Currency Transaction Reports, Suspicious Activity Reports, daily logs, internal audit reports, or any other internal or external reports from the previous month that address potential failures in the internal control systems and any real or potential compliance issues related to the statues and regulations governing controlled gambling in the State of California.
- 5. Normandie Club shall continue to retain a consultant with demonstrable credentials in the policies and procedures governing the operation of California or Asian games. Further, the consultant shall spend a minimum of 30 hours per week observing the operation of these games and provide a written report to the compliance committee and to the Bureau of Gambling Control recording the following:
 - a) Any witnessed violations of Normandie Club's existing policies and procedures

- b) Any recommended changes to Normandie Club's policies and procedures
- c) Any unusual or suspicious circumstances concerning the operation of the facility
