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MINUTES OF DECEMBER 18, 2017 COMMISSION MEETING

OPEN SESSION

1. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Evans called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Roll Call of Commissioners.

Roll Call of Commissioners was taken with Chairman Jim Evans, Commissioner Paula LaBrie, and Commissioner Trang To present.

Chairman Evans briefly thanked Commission and Bureau staff for their hard work put forth throughout 2017, and especially in regards to the current Commission Meeting.

Mr. Maloney noted for the record that the Applicant was timely, responsive, and has fully cooperated with the Bureau's requests for additional information. Mr. Maloney also acknowledged that Mr. Ayers has some personal issues that Mr. Ayers continues to work on. Mr. Maloney affirmed that Mr. Ayers realizes this is a privileged industry and understands the importance of compliance. Mr. Maloney stated that Mr. Ayers has invested approximately \$1.7 million on the building of the Elks Tower Casino & Lounge and has surrounded himself with good staff. Further, Mr. Maloney discussed the conditions recommended if a Temporary State Gambling License were to be approved.

Commissioner To expressed concern with the history of Carl Corporation, a corporation Mr. Ayers was the shareholder of.

Mr. Maloney responded that all matters personally against Mr. Ayers were dismissed. Further, Mr. Maloney provided a brief history of the matter. Mr. Maloney also stated that since 1990, Mr. Ayers has run dozens of highly successful businesses, and has had no regulatory issues in all aspects of his businesses since that time.

Commissioner To further expressed concern stemming from a recent 911 call. Mr. Maloney responded how Mr. Ayers regrets the incident, and discussed the progress Mr. Ayers has made since the incident in his personal life. Mr. Maloney further noted that Mr. Ayers has remained transparent and forthcoming with his responses to the Bureau's questions.

Chairman Evans asked Assistant Director Morrow if she thought there was more information needed or available regarding the history of Carl Corporation and Mr. Ayers. Assistant Director Morrow responded that the Bureau has obtained everything that they could get, and that the Bureau would not be able to obtain any additional information other than what was already provided. Assistant Director Morrow referenced that the Applicant might be able to provide additional information. Chairman Evans stated he was also concerned about the more recent incidents. Further, Chairman Evans commented that granting a temporary license prior to proving suitability may not be the best option.

Mr. Maloney discussed his concern which he believed were in the interests of preserving the license, and requested the Commission grant Mr. Ayers a Temporary State Gambling License.

Chief Counsel Vlaanderen stated that William Blanas's State Gambling License will be valid through April 2018, and could be extended or renewed in order to preserve the State Gambling License if there were concerns about the moratorium.

Mr. Blanas expressed great concern regarding his requirement to continue to pay vast table fees until the sale is completed and urged approval. Chief Counsel Vlaanderen stated that table fees must be paid in order to avoid closure and surrender of the State Gambling License. Executive Director Luna Baxter added that there is an option to reduce the number of authorized tables in order to reduce the annual fees. Assistant Director Morrow explained that Mr. Blanas may request a reduction in tables, and noted that was previously discussed in detail at the June 23, 2016 meeting; however, Mr. Blanas had not submitted such a request to date.

Mr. Wasson expressed his concerns regarding the timing and the city ordinance requirements.

Mr. Thomas stated that the city is prepared to grant a license subject to Commission approval of a State Gambling License. Mr. Thomas discussed the issuance of the conditional use permit and asserted that the local business license was tentatively approved subject to the State License process. Mr. Thomas discussed that if a temporary license was not approved; the city was in jeopardy of losing this license.

Representatives for members of the public commented during the public comment period regarding their views concerning the city code, suitability of the applicant to be granted a license, and the propriety of the transaction.

The interested parties and their representatives were provided opportunity to respond.

Chairman Evans made a motion to refer the Initial License to a GCA hearing. This motion did not receive a second.

Commissioner To made a motion to refer the matter to a GCA hearing and approve a Temporary State Gambling License through December 31, 2018 with conditions. Commissioner LaBrie seconded the motion.

Chairman Evans asked Mr. Sharp to summarize the letter recently received from the City Manager of Cudahy. Mr. Sharp responded regarding the context of the letter and noted that the letter is irrelevant to the process of the purchase agreement.

Mr. Blonien stated that the City of Cudahy is concerned with the safety of the location and requested a 30-day continuance on this matter. Chairman Evans explained that the City would still need to approve a local license request before a cardroom could be opened.

Mr. Gondek expressed his concern that the city of Cudahy has not had an opportunity to speak with the applicant regarding the sale and would welcome an opportunity to engage with the applicant about upcoming plans for its location, permit, and the community.

Mr. Altizer briefly discussed the procedural history of the license at a State and local level. Mr. Altizer expressed his support for the transaction to be approved.

- 3. Acknowledgement that No Transfer of Interest May Occur Without the Commission's Prior Approval The Buyer and Mr. Larry Flynt must provide written documentation; within 15 days after closing, to both the Commission and the Bureau, acknowledging that they fully understand and agree: (a) interests held in gambling establishments cannot be transferred to any person who is not licensed or registered under the Act; (b) interests held in gambling establishments cannot be sold, assigned, transferred, pledged, or otherwise disposed of, or options granted to do so, without the Commission's prior approval; and (c) as a holder of interests in gambling establishments, the Buyer and Mr. Flynt must comply with the Act in all respects.
- 4. Final Transaction Documents Both the Buyer and Mr. Flynt must provide copies of all executed transaction documents, including final schedules and exhibits, to the Commission and to the Bureau within 15 days after closing.

5. No Material Change in the Contemplated Transactions – The Buyer and Mr. Flynt must provide written confirmation to the Commission and the Bureau, that the parties made no material changes to the transactions and the transactions were consummated as approved by the Commission.

Pankey Living Trust (Trust) includes, or will include ownership interests in a California licensed gambling establishment and Third-Party Provider of Proposition Player Services. Collectively, the ownership interests will be referred to as the "Gambling Interest."
- 2. Gambling Interest Acknowledgement. The Settlor and Trustee acknowledge in writing to the Commission, with a copy to the Bureau, that the Trust includes, or will include, the Gambling Interest, which is subject to the Gambling Control Act (Act) (Bus. & Prof. Code § 19800 et seq.) and is subject to regulation by the Commission, Bureau, or similar agency. The Settlor and Trustee also will acknowledge the following:
 - A. The Act and regulations adopted under it require certain individuals and entities to hold licenses or registrations, including, among others, partners, members, shareholders, trusts, and trustees.
 - B. The Act and regulations adopted under it provide that licensing or registration of certain persons and entities is necessary for a non-natural person to be eligible for a license or registration.
 - C. The Act and regulations adopted under it make void certain dispositions of ownership interests, or prospective rights in ownership interests, in entities such as partnerships, limited liability companies, and corporations without the Commission's prior approval.
 - D. The Act prohibits certain persons from holding a position, or engaging in an activity, until he, she, or it secures the required license or registration.
- Gambling Interest Disposition or Holding. The Settlor and the Trustee acknowledge in writing to the Commission, with a copy to the Bureau, that the Gambling Interest shall be distributed only to beneficiaries or other persons, and held only by trustees, who are licensed, or otherwise permitted, by the Commission to hold and receive such interests.
- 4. Compliance with the California Gambling Laws. The Settlor and the Trustee acknowledge in writing to the Commission, with a copy to

the Bureau, that, notwithstanding any other provision of the Trust and for as long as the Trust holds the Gambling Interest, or an ownership interest in an entity subject to California gambling laws and regulation by the Commission, the Bureau, or similar agency, the Trustee and any successor Trustee shall comply in all respects with California gambling laws and regulations, including, without limitation, Penal Code sections 319 to 337.9 and the Act. The acknowledgment shall include the statement: "Nothing in the Trust shall authorize or otherwise empower the Trustee, or any successor Trustee, to enter into any transaction, acquire or dispose of any interest, or engage in any conduct that violates, or does not comply with, California gambling laws and regulations. Specifically, and by way of example only, the Trustee shall not change the situs or governing law of the Trust, or create additional trusts to hold property, so as to avoid, eliminate, or impede, the application of, or compliance with, California gambling laws. For as long as the Trust holds the Gambling Interest or an ownership interest in an entity subject to California gambling laws and regulations, the Trust's and its Trustee's right, power, or privilege to hold that ownership interest depends upon compliance with such laws and regulations in all material respects."

Any transfer of shares in the Corporation will not be complete unless and until the Trust, through its Trustee, signs a shareholders agreement signature page and the Corporation accepts his signature.
