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MINUTES OF THE JUNE 13, 2019 COMMISSION MEETING

OPEN SESSION

1. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance.

Acting Chairman To called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m., and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Roll Call of Commissioners.

Roll Call of Commissioners was taken with Acting Chairman To, Commissioner Paula LaBrie, and Commissioner Gareth Lacy, present. Chairman Evans was absent.

Executive Director Stacey Luna Baxter welcomed the Commission's newest staff member, Deputy Director of Legislation and Regulatory Affairs Joshua (Josh) Speaks. Executive Director Luna Baxter stated that Deputy Director Speaks prior employment was at the Commission on Teacher Credentialing where he managed their legislation, public affairs, and regulations. Deputy Director Speaks is familiar with the Commission aspect and a smaller size agency. Executive Director further stated that Josh also spent many years as a legislative manager in multiple agencies, one of which the California Department of Conservation. Executive Director again welcomed Deputy Director Speaks and looks forward to working with him. The Commissioners echoed Executive Director Luna Baxter's welcome as well.

Assistant Direct Morrow also stated that Ms. Guard sent in a letter, but there was no record that she is Mr. Reynold's Designated Agent.

Adrianna Alcala-Beshara, Deputy Director of Licensing, Gambling Control Commission, in person

Commissioner Lacy discussed that the matter was carried over from a prior meeting and he wanted to clarify with the applicant why the applicant did not include a conviction on her application.

Ms. Chavez stated that she did not disclose her suspended license conviction because she thought it was an infraction, she did not believe that it was something she had to note and thought the disclosure of the DUI (driving under the influence) conviction was sufficient. Ms. Chavez further stated that she didn't have much knowledge; she didn't understand it was a conviction, and she believed it did not need to be disclosed. Commissioner Lacy noted that he found her explanation somewhat reasonable, but at the same time, somewhat difficult to evaluate.

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Commissioner LaBrie concurred with Commissioner Lacy's assessment and further stated that there were a couple other failures to disclose which concerned her and it appears somewhat of a pattern of disregard for the law when presented with the current information and an evidentiary hearing may be the best course to flesh out all of the issues and get a better understanding.

Acting Chairman To stated that he concurred with his colleagues and asked Ms. Chavez what was the status of her driver's license.

Ms. Chavez stated that she has had an active driver's license for the last four years and has not had it taken away.

Commissioner Lacy asked the applicant what steps has she taken since the conviction for personal growth.

Ms. Chavez stated that she has maintained her license, stayed away from getting tickets, stayed away from trouble, and she has been working and going to school. Ms. Chavez also stated that she has learned from her court recommended or imposed courses.

Ms. Chavez stated she has had no other encounters with law enforcement since that time.

Acting Chairman To stated that from the information presented in the report and the information presented by the applicant, he is inclined to support the application being referred to a GCA hearing to get a more in depth perspective and understanding of the matters presented.

Commissioner LaBrie agreed and discussed her concerns.

Licensing Deputy Director Alcala-Beshara noted that Ms. Chavez can continue to work if the application is referred to an evidentiary hearing.

Commissioner LaBrie made a motion to refer the matter to evidentiary hearing, the motion did not pass.

Commissioner Lacy noted that he is not certain what referring to an evidentiary hearing would accomplish as to state of mind, as the applicant clearly explained that she did not disclose the driving on a suspended license because she did not understand it to be a misdemeanor and understood it to be an infraction, but he would be willing to hear the matter at a GCA hearing.

Commissioner LaBrie noted that the applicant would be able to continue working, and understands what Commissioner Lacy is saying; however, her concern is from a

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broader perspective as there appears there may be a pattern and there are other pieces not clear why they were not disclosed.

Acting Chairman To noted also that he would be more comfortable in a GCA setting and to see the applicant in person.

Licensing Deputy Director Alcala-Beshara noted that it also appeared that although Ms. Chavez just stated that the reason she did not disclose the conviction was because she misunderstood the conviction to be an infraction and therefore didn't think she needed to disclose, in her background answers to the Commission it appears that she conversely stated that the reason for non-disclosure was not that she didn't think she had to disclose, but she thought that she already had disclosed the conviction.

Failed Motion:

Upon motion of Commissioner LaBrie, seconded by Acting Chairman To, and a vote by roll call with Acting Chairman To, Commissioners LaBrie, voting yes, and Commissioner Lacy voting no; the motion to refer the matter to an evidentiary hearing failed.

Yolanda Morrow, Assistant Director, Bureau of Gambling Control, in person

Commissioner LaBrie stated that from the Bureau's report it appears that Ms. Phon did disclose the employment, but it does not appear that she disclosed her termination. Ms. Phon stated that she was terminated from employment due to being late for work. Commissioner LaBrie further noted that Ms. Phon has been working in the controlled gambling industry for over five years without incident. However, because the Bureau was unable to verify the employment and reason for separation, and because the non-disclosure occurred, how can she be sure that was the actual reason she was terminated.

Commissioner LaBrie asked Ms. Phon about the circumstances surrounding her termination.

Ms. Phon stated that she had advised her work that she needed to be with her family and go to a local municipality office. The former employer however responded that

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she was aware that the office was closed that day and learned Ms. Phon was not truthful in her statement and thereafter terminated her.

Ms. Phon stated that she did not receive correspondence and she did not receive unemployment benefits.

Assistant Director Morrow confirmed that the Bureau could not verify employment as they contacted Ms. Phon's former employer and received no response.

Ms. Phon stated that she realized she should have been honest with her former employer and understands the importance of responsibility. She also noted the growth she has made since such time.

Commissioner LaBrie discussed the importance of full disclosure and why it is so important in the controlled gambling industry.

Action:

Upon motion of Commissioner Lacy, seconded by Commissioner LaBrie, and carried in a vote by roll call with Acting Chairman To, Commissioners LaBrie, and Commissioner Lacy, voting yes; the Commission referred the application to a GCA evidentiary hearing.

Commissioner Lacy discussed the application and why he was inclined to approve the matter.

Assistant Director Morrow confirmed the applicant was cooperative in providing the follow up information and the Bureau had since changed their recommendation to approval.

Commissioner Lacy discussed the application and why he was inclined to make a motion to refer the consideration of Ms. Serpa's application to an evidentiary hearing.

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Acting Chairman To and Commissioner LaBrie concurred with Commissioner Lacy's statement and stated he too has concerns with the assessment.

Upon motion of Commissioner Lacy, seconded by Commissioner LaBrie, and carried in a vote by roll call with Acting Chairman To, Commissioners LaBrie, and Commissioner Lacy, voting yes; the Commission referred the application to a GCA evidentiary hearing.

Commissioner Lacy stated his concerns are present as there seems to be carelessness in the application process.

Mr. Walden stated that he had filled out his applications all from memory, he had no records with him at the time, and there were mistakes.

At both Relief Mart and USA Gas he was working about 55 hours a week and both terminations were similar in nature.

Commissioner Lacy then expressed concern as it appeared that after Mr. Walden was given a chance to correct his application he still had discrepancies.

Mr. Walden apologized and acknowledged the errors. He stated he should have taken more consideration when completing his responses and should have asked for more time to ensure the information was accurate the first time.

Commissioner LaBrie concurred with Commissioner Lacy and noted that he did disclose one of his terminations.

Mr. Walden further discussed the circumstances of his non-disclosure. Mr. Walden stated he has learned to present his information correctly the first time and ask for additional information where he needed.

Upon motion of Commissioner Lacy, seconded by Commissioner LaBrie, and carried in a vote by roll call with Acting Chairman To, Commissioners LaBrie, and Commissioner Lacy, voting yes; the Commission approved the Initial Third-Party Providers of Proposition Player Services Player License through June 30, 2021.

Commissioner Lacy expressed that he believed Mr. Ponte, Jr.'s letter was thoughtful, thorough, and helpful.

Assistant Director Morrow stated the Bureau expressed some concern as Mr. Ponte, Jr. had informed the Bureau that he was not aware that he was terminated for not following the break policy. However; in his unemployment documentation, he did indicate to the California Employment Development Department (EDD) at that time that he was terminated for not following the break policy. The Bureau did wish to discuss the matter internally further, but he did not agree to an extension. As such, the information is submitted and the Bureau stands by their recommendation of approval.

Mr. Ponte, Jr. discussed in depth the circumstances that led to his termination of employment and his EDD application history.

Upon motion of Commissioner Lacy, seconded by Commissioner LaBrie, and carried in a vote by roll call with Acting Chairman To, Commissioners LaBrie, and

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Commissioner Lacy, voting yes; the Commission approved the Initial Finding of Suitability through February 12, 2020.

Acting Chairman To asked Mr. Nguyen if he agreed to the existing condition placed on his Renewal Finding of Suitability.

Mr. Nguyen confirmed that he did.

Todd Vlaanderen, Chief Counsel, Gambling Control Commission, in person Bill Torngren, Deputy Attorney General (DAG), Indian and Gaming Law Section (IGLS), Department of Justice, Representing the Bureau, in person Stephen Schneider, Attorney, Representing Michelle Miller-Wahler, via telephone Mr. Dorn Bishop, Attorney, Representing David La, via telephone

Chief Counsel Vlaanderen stated in October 2013, the Bureau filed an accusation against Normandie Club, Russell Miller, Lawrence Miller, Gregory Miller, Stephen Miller, Michelle Miller-Wahler and David La. All but Michelle Miller-Wahler and David La resolved their portions of the accusation in 2016. The remaining two respondents in this matter and the Bureau have submitted a stipulated settlement for the

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Commission's consideration that would resolve the proceedings for the remaining parties subject to the accusation. This matter was placed on agenda for open session in order to provide the Commissioners the opportunity to ask questions if you have any. The matter will be deliberated and decided on in Closed Session.

Commissioner Lacy asked to confirm there were no pending applications today.

DAG Torngren on behalf of the Bureau stated to their knowledge there are no outstanding applications as inquiries were made to the Bureau and to the Commission's website.

Mr. Schneider on behalf of Michelle Miller-Wahler concurred.

Mr. Bishop on behalf of Mr. La also concurred.

Commissioner Lacy then stated the other concern was that the settlement seemed to allow the individuals to work in a non-key role.

DAG Torngren stated that Mr. La and Ms. Miller-Wahler may attempt to work in a non-key role, which is why IGLS reserved the opportunity for the Bureau to comment or to object if there is any local license or work permit issued or application submitted. DAG Torngren stated that as the Commission does not have the jurisdiction over local work permits, there were jurisdictional considerations contemplated within the settlement.

Commissioners adjourned into closed session at 11:15 AM to consider Items II.H. and II.I. Thereafter the Commissioners returned into open session.

Upon returning from Closed Session, Acting Commissioner To announced that the Commissioners disapproved the proposed settlements. Acting Chairman To expressed the Commission's concern is that the three years of the ineligibility is not sufficient to protect the public given the parties admissions in the proposed settlements.

Commissioner Lacy noted that others involved in the Normandie incident had up to seven year ineligibility periods and others had total revocations.

DAG Torngren asked to address the Commission. DAG Torngren stated that as to the owners, three of the four brothers received lifetime bans and one had a seven year and he had cooperated with the Bureau. DAG Torngren asked for the Commission to remember that those were the owners as opposed to these key employees. DAG Torngren noted that his concern is that if the Bureau went to hearing to prove up the very same case, prove up the same admissions with video etcetera, at the end of the day the best that can be achieved is a revocation and potentially penalties and costs can be imposed. DAG Torngren commented that he wasn't certain if the Commission has the power as Commissioners to do a lifetime

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ban or a seven year ban outside of an agreement. Therefore, IGLS believes that the stipulation with a three year ban achieved more than the possible outcome from an Administrative Law Judge. That is why the Bureau opted for three years and then of course as that is presented with the complexities of getting all parties to agree and stipulated. DAG Torngren further stated that having said that, he was uncertain that would change the Commission's position, but he believed there needed to be some understanding as to the reason that the Bureau reached the level that the Bureau reached as opposed to something greater. DAG Torngren further stated that if the Commission had any questions, he was happy to address them.

Acting Chairman To and Commissioner Lacy thanked DAG Torngren for his comments.

Acting Chairman To stated that the Commission stands by their decision for the settlement and thanked the parties.
