OPEN SESSION

1. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance.

Chairman Evans called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m., and asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commission Meeting Minutes of February 7, 2019

Commissioner Lacy expressed concern regarding the source of funds related to the \$112,000 gift for the year of the donation and would like to learn more because the numbers do not add up with the information provided.

Commissioner To agreed with Commissioner Lacy and requested more information regarding the source of the income prior to 2014.

Assistant Director Morrow stated the Bureau investigated back to 2014, but if the Commissioners would like more information, the Bureau can go back to 2013.

Commissioner LaBrie stated it was her understanding that the gifting occurred over a period of three or four years, in small increments that totaled \$112,000.00.

Designated Agent Blonien stated the gift was provided over a period of time and was split between two sons. Designated Agent Blonien stated Ms. Xiong cared for others at the time, which explains why the income was lower, and provided elaboration and discussion regarding the household finances.

Commissioner LaBrie asked Designated Agent Blonien if the reported living expenses were specific to the parents and if everyone was living in the same household.

Designated Agent Blonien agreed that the expenses were specific to the parents and everyone contributes for the household expenses.

Chairman Evans called forth the applicant to ask if he was present. The applicant was not present in person or by telephone.

Chairman Evans confirmed Mr. Marquez's Work Permit has been cancelled and he would have liked to talk to Mr. Marquez regarding past violations in order to determine if the case should be referred to an evidentiary hearing. Further, Chairman Evans stated that Mr. Marquez requested his application be abandoned.

Commissioner Lacy and Commissioner LaBrie expressed their concerns regarding the applicant.

Chief Counsel Vlaanderen stated that if the Commission deems Mr. Marquez's application abandoned, he may immediately return to the gambling industry, get a temporary work permit again, and be able to work until the Bureau completes a new background investigation report.

Commissioner To asked why Mr. Marquez was not attending the meeting today.

Deputy Director Alcala-Beshara responded Mr. Marquez had indicated he did not want to pursue his application any longer because he is no longer employed with the entity under which he applied.

Commissioner To stated this particular agenda item may be related to previous cases currently in the APA hearing process and asked the Bureau to address the issue.

Assistant Director Morrow stated part of the Bureau recommendation on the other application (currently in the APA hearing process) involves the system mentioned in this report; however, the recommendation on this applicant is based on her being untruthful to the Bureau during a site visit.

Chairman Evans asked Assistant Director Morrow what the Bureau's recommendation is and if there is a preference for a GCA or APA hearing.

Assistant Director Morrow replied the Bureau's recommendation remains a denial, and there is no preference with regard to a GCA or APA hearing.

Commissioner To expressed that if this case is referred to a GCA hearing, the evidence may overflow into the pending APA hearing case.

Assistant Director Morrow responded that she did not foresee the cases connecting.

Commissioner Lacy stated his concern with the cases intersecting is with the witnesses. Further, Commissioner Lacy stated the applicant was possibly acting from direction of her supervisors and expressed it may be helpful to hear from the owner, involved with the case referred to an APA hearing, at the GCA hearing as well.

Chief Counsel Vlaanderen stated it would not be the first time the Commissioners got partly into a GCA hearing and then decided that the issues were more complex, or overlapped, and subsequently referred the case to an APA hearing.

Commissioner Lacy stated it would be helpful to hear from the Bureau analysts or investigators involved in this case and asked if they would be able to attend the hearing.

Assistant Director Morrow stated the Bureau employees involved at the time were Executive Director Stacey Luna Baxter and herself, and that she would be able to attend the hearing to provide testimony.

Commissioner Lacy expressed concern for the applicant's misleading statements in 2018.
