A YEAR OF CHANGES AND CHALLENGES, AND HOW WE RESPONDED TOGETHER

This past year has been extremely challenging for everybody. We all had to drastically alter our everyday lives, including changes to our work routines. In the Commission's case, our job, our responsibility, includes working with our stakeholders to ensure safe operations. Over the past year, the Commission took action to assist the industry in meeting the challenges of the past year.

Commission staff quickly developed a COVID-19 FAQ page and a COVID-19 Updates page as a way to keep our stakeholders up-to-date on the latest information, with an emphasis on how statewide orders specifically impacted the cardroom industry. We also collaborated with the Governor's Office and the Department of Public Health to establish guidelines for the reopening of cardrooms and the transition to outdoor operations, as well as Executive Orders addressing fee, application, and report submission requirements.

These emergency guidelines came with the need for emergency regulations, and a joint effort between the Commission, the Bureau of Gambling Control, and our industry stakeholders produced emergency regulations for remote counts and sanitation plans. In addition, the Commission is proposing emergency regulations regarding financial reporting requirements and temporary table decreases.

These were developed alongside various other Commission undertakings: our <u>2020-2023 Strategic Plan</u>, the overhaul of the <u>Licensing Regulations</u>, the development of our new <u>Education page</u>, adding license conditions to our <u>website</u>, and more.

All this was done while transitioning from the office to telework while maintaining full accessibility and productivity. It could not have happened without the exceptional efforts of the Commission staff, nor without the input from the industry. This special edition newsletter is going to highlight a few new things that are direct results of the Commission listening to our stakeholders and implementing them to benefit the industry.

As we continue to navigate the current climate, I want to encourage the industry to continue to collaborate with the Commission and maintain our collective goal of ensuring controlled gaming in California is conducted safely. 
- <u>Licensing Overhaul General Overview</u>

At an industry workshop hosted by the Commission and the Bureau, one of our stakeholders raised the idea of posting licensing conditions on the Commission's website. Licensing conditions are included in correspondence sent to licensees by the Commission, but there was not a central location to find licensing conditions in one place.

In response to this excellent idea, the Commission's Licensing Division spearheaded a joint operation with the Legal Division and our tech support team to update our website's licensure database to include the conditions placed on the licenses for cardrooms, third-party providers of proposition player services, and vendors.

To access the listings, go to the Commission's <u>website</u>, click on the <u>Gaming/License</u> tab, and click on <u>Licensees and Registrants</u>. From there, you can view licensing information on all Commission licensees.

The conditions information is posted as PDF files of either a card-room's State Gambling License endorsement, or of correspondence from the Commission's Licensing Division to the licensee. Our Legal Division ensured that any confidential information, such as addresses, is redacted from any documents posted to this page.

The conditions documents will be updated to reflect the placement, removal, or modification of conditions following the Commission's regular Thursday meetings.
