Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19823, subdivision (a)(1), it is the Commission's responsibility to ensure "that licenses... are not.... held by, unqualified or disqualified persons, or by persons whose operations are conducted in a manner that is inimical 8 to the public health, safety, or welfare." (Unqualified Person) 10 Business and Professions Code section 19823, subdivision (b), defines an "unqualified 11 person" for purposes of that section as "a person who is found to be unqualified pursuant to the 12 criteria set forth in Section 19857." 13 14 Pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19857, subdivision (b), an 15 "unqualified person" includes: A person whose prior activities, [or] criminal record 16 ... enhance the dangers of unsuitable, unfair, or illegal practices, methods, and activities in the conduct of 17 controlled gambling or in the carrying on of the business and financial arrangements incidental thereto. .18 19 (Disqualified Person) 20 Business and Professions Code section 19823, subdivision (b), defines a "disqualified person" for purposes of that section as "a person who is found to be disqualified pursuant to the 21 22 criteria set forth in Section 19859." 10. Whether for gain, hire, reward, or gratuitously, or otherwise, receives, holds, or forwards, or purports or pretends to receive, hold, or forward, in any manner whatsoever, any money, thing or consideration of value, or the equivalent or memorandum thereof, staked, pledged, pet or wagered, or to be staked, pledged, bet or wagered, or offered for any purpose of being staked, pledged, bet or wagered, upon the result, or purported result, of any trial, or purported trial, or contest, or purported contest, of skill, speed or power of endurance of person or animal, or between persons, animals, or mechanical apparatus, or upon the result, or purported result, of any lot, chance, casualty, unknown or contingent event whatsoever.

(Employment of Gambling Employee Without Work Permit)

- 19. Business and Professions Code section 19922 prohibits a licensee from operating a gambling establishment in violation of any provision of the Gambling Control Act or any regulation adopted pursuant to the Gambling Control Act.
- 20. Business and Professions Code section 19912, subdivision (a)(1) prohibits a licensee from employing a gambling enterprise employee who does not have a valid work permit.

(Violation of Local Work Permit Ordinance)

- 21. Business and Professions Code section 19923 prohibits a licensee from operating a gambling enterprise in violation of any governing local ordinance.
 - 22. City of Antioch Municipal Code, Chapter 4, section 5-4.09 states:

No person shall work as a card room employee without first obtaining a work permit from the Chief of Police, nor shall any licensee of a card room employ any person
