

California Gambling Control Commission
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**MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER 15, 2020
COMMISSION MEETING**

Pursuant to Executive Orders N-25-20 and N-29-20 regarding the COVID-19 virus, the meeting was held by tele/videoconference and there was no location open to the public.

OPEN SESSION

1. Call to Order.

Acting Chairman To called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

2. Roll Call of Commissioners was taken with Acting Chairman Trang To, Commissioner Paula LaBrie, and Commissioner Gareth Lacy present.

Executive Director Stacey Luna Baxter gave ZOOM participation instructions.

Upon motion of Commissioner Lacy, seconded by Commissioner LaBrie, and carried in a vote by roll call with Acting Chairman To, Commissioner LaBrie, and Commissioner Lacy, voting yes; the Commission approved the August 7, 2020, and the August 28, 2020, GCA Hearing Minutes.

Commissioner LaBrie stated she recalled this was tabled to a future Commission Meeting to allow time for staff's analysis regarding the recommendation of consolidation with the Lake Elsinore Hotel & Casino APA hearing that will be

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underway early next year. Commissioner LaBrie thanked staff and Deputy Attorney General (DAG), Bill Torngren, and agreed with staff's recommendation.

Commissioner Lacy agreed with the recommendation to consolidate with the Lake Elsinore Hotel & Casino APA evidentiary hearing.

Mr. Schreiner agreed with the Commissioners to consolidate the matter with the pending APA hearing.

DAG Torngren also agreed to consolidate the matter with the pending APA hearing.

Commissioner LaBrie asked the Bureau if Mr. Ozuna Jr. had established any arrangements to satisfy the debt since late May.

Assistant Director Morrow responded that she did not believe so and deferred to SSMII Gilleland.

SSM II Gilleland stated the Bureau does not have anything more current from Mr. Ozuna Jr.

Commissioner Lacy asked Mr. Perez if there was a written policy or verbal communication about the forfeiting of leftover exchange gift cards.

Mr. Perez responded that he did not recall a written policy and only encountered the instances when they occurred on the floor.

Commissioner Lacy asked Mr. Perez if he believed he was following the appropriate store policy and at the time.

Mr. Perez responded that everyone was following the policy.

Commissioner LaBrie asked for confirmation that it was with the permission of the manager or lead that employees kept the leftover exchange gift cards.

Mr. Perez confirmed that he received verbal approval.

Commissioner Lacy requested confirmation from Mr. Perez whether he understands and would comply with the proposed condition.

Mr. Perez confirmed his understanding and assent to the condition.

Action:

Upon motion of Chairman Lacy, seconded by Commissioner LaBrie, and carried in a vote by roll call with Acting Chairman To, Commissioner LaBrie, and Commissioner Lacy, voting yes; the Commission approved the conversion of the registration to Initial License through October 31, 2022, with the condition noted below:

Beginning December 1, 2020, and every 90 days thereafter, Gabriel Perez must provide the Bureau of Gambling Control proof of ongoing efforts to resolve his Failure to Pay until resolved and proof of resolution is provided to the Bureau.

Yolanda Morrow, Assistant Director, Bureau of Gambling Control, via video

Commissioner Lacy stated he's inclined to refer to the application to a GCA hearing as Ms. Garrido had two different answers.

Commissioner LaBrie asked Ms. Garrido if the other person involved in the incident was arrested as well.

Ms. Garrido responded that the other person involved was not charged as the incident occurred at the other person's house, where she lived with Ms. Garrido's ex-husband.

Commissioner LaBrie asked Ms. Garrido why she did not disclose the conviction on her application.

Ms. Garrido responded she thought the charges were dropped after mediation and her record would be cleared.

Commissioner LaBrie noted Ms. Garrido's statement that only felonies would need be disclosed.

Ms. Garrido confirmed that when she went to mediation she was under the impression that the conviction was no longer going to be on her record.

Commissioner Lacy asked Ms. Garrido if she knew that misdemeanors were required to be disclosed on her application.

Ms. Garrido responded she understood the requirement to disclose misdemeanors; however, she thought her record was clear.

Commissioner Lacy then asked Ms. Garrido why her statement revealed that she thought she was only to list felonies on her application.

Ms. Garrido stated she felt the felony section and the misdemeanor section of the application were two separate questions.

Acting Chairman To asked the Bureau if they have Ms. Garrido's application to reference.

Assistant Director Morrow stated the application asks if you have ever been convicted of a felony, and if you have been convicted of a misdemeanor in the last ten years. Assistant Director Morrow stated that Ms. Garrido answered no to both questions.

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Commissioner LaBrie asked Ms. Garrido what was explained to her once the mediation had concluded. Further, Commissioner LaBrie asked Ms. Garrido if she had an attorney.

Ms. Garrido stated she did not have an attorney and there was a restraining order that was eventually dropped.

Commissioner LaBrie asked Ms. Garrido if she was told the conviction had been dropped.

Ms. Garrido admitted she assumed the conviction had been dropped because it was not revealed in other background investigations she was involved with.

Commissioner Lacy asked if she was arrested by police on the day of the incident.

Ms. Garrido confirmed she was arrested by police on the day of the incident.

Acting Chairman To asked if Ms. Garrido was provided a Public Defender and if the Public Defender explained the process to her and what it meant.

Ms. Garrido responded she was informed about the three-year probation and a fine.

Acting Chairman To asked Ms. Garrido if she was informed that after a certain amount of time she could petition to have the charges dropped.

Ms. Garrido responded that she was not informed of that.

Commissioner LaBrie asked when the restraining orders were dropped.

Ms. Garrido responded she believed the restraining order was dropped after the mediation.

Commissioner LaBrie stated she was satisfied that the applicant thought there was not a misdemeanor on her record.

Commissioner Lacy agreed with Commissioner LaBrie and appreciates the applicant being present at the Commission Meeting.

Acting Chairman To stated Ms. Garrido has been convicted of a misdemeanor and at the very least she should have disclosed the conviction.

Commissioner Lacy concurred that Ms. Garrido should have disclosed the conviction on the supplemental application.

Acting Chairman To informed Ms. Garrido that being referred to a GCA evidentiary hearing will allow her an opportunity to present her side of the story and allow the Commission to better understand and make an informed decision on the application.

Upon motion of Acting Chairman To, seconded by Commissioner Lacy, and carried in a vote by roll call with Acting Chairman To, Commissioner LaBrie, and Commissioner Lacy, voting yes; the Commission referred the item to a GCA evidentiary hearing.

Commissioner Lacy expressed concern with the most recent letter which seemed to clearly state that the applicant was not honest and transparent with the Bureau in the application process which requires the Commission to deny a license.

Commissioner LaBrie agreed with Commissioner Lacy and thought that sending to a GCA to get a little more information on Mr. Andrade's state of mind while filling out the application. Commissioner LaBrie then stated that she appreciates Mr. Andrade's letter as he does show remorse, but he did intentionally withhold information from the Bureau.

Acting Chairman To stated he felt concern and was uneasy regarding Mr. Andrade intentionally leaving out the sexual harassment allegation and thinks the application is better vetted in a GCA evidentiary hearing.

Upon motion of Commissioner LaBrie, seconded by Commissioner Lacy, and carried in a vote by roll call with Acting Chairman To, Commissioner LaBrie, and Commissioner Lacy, voting yes; the Commission referred the item to a GCA evidentiary hearing.

Acting Chairman To asked the Bureau if Ms. Rogers' current balance on her outstanding fine was \$1.20.

Assistant Director Morrow confirmed that \$1.20 is the outstanding amount.

Commissioner LaBrie was not sure that the Commission needed to continue with the condition with that low of a balance.

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Commissioner Lacy and Acting Chairman To agreed with Commissioner LaBrie.

Executive Director Luna Baxter stated that in order to remain consistent, the Commission should keep the condition on the finding of suitability until the balance is paid in full as it is considered an outstanding balance.

Commissioner Lacy stated that the balance is with the Court and the applicant needs to provide an update that they are working on it.

Acting Chairman To asked if Ms. Rogers was available at the meeting. Ms. Rogers did not announce herself.

Assistant Director Morrow stated the Bureau will reach out to the applicant and the Court and will have an update for the Commission soon.

The applicant received notice in two ways:

First, Mr. Cooper was sent an evidentiary hearing referral letter on July 10, 2020 via certified and regular mail with a blank Notice of Defense and instructions to return in 15 days. Staff received no response.

Second, a notice of evidentiary hearing was sent to Mr. Cooper on September 1, 2020 which stated the hearing was set to occur on October 15, 2020 at 10:00 am. Staff received no response.

The Decision has standard language and terms and denies the applicant's application under the Business and Professions code section 19856 and cancels his registrations under Commission regulations.

The Commission has made the effective date 30 days from October 15, 2020, which lands on a weekend. Therefore, the Decision would be effective on the subsequent business day, Monday November 16, 2020, which is consistent with recent Defaults during the COVID-19 emergency.

Acting Chairman To asked if Mr. Cooper was available. Mr. Cooper did not announce himself.
